



## **Hanesbrands**

## **DESCRIPTION:**

Hanesbrands (Hanes) scored a 60 on the 2023 Corporate Equality Index (CEI) from the Human Rights Campaign (HRC), a political stakeholder group. By complying with Human Rights Campaign's controversial demands, Hanes increases the risk of dividing employees, alienating customers and harming shareholders. The company covers transgender-related medical costs for its employees and their children. It also uses sex and gender ideology criteria in employee recruitment, vendor selection, and philanthropic support. Hanes uses its corporate funds to support controversial sex and gender ideologies and organizations. Hanesbrands does not provide viewpoint protections for its employees. However, it has not publicly terminated business relationships based on views or beliefs. Hanes is a signatory of the Business Roundtable's 2019 Statement on the Purpose of Corporation, which promotes stakeholder capitalism. For these reasons, Hanesbrands receives a Medium Risk rating.

## **Corporate Weaponization**

Has denied service to customers, suppliers, or vendors due to their political views or religious Mediu beliefs OR corporately boycotts, divests, or sanctions regions, people groups, or industries.

**Medium Risk** 

Hanesbrands received a score of 60 recruits employees based on sexual identity issues. The company discriminates against vendors that do not promote divisive sex and gender policies, indicating it prioritizes sexual issues over merit ( $\underline{1}$ )( $\underline{2}$ ). However, Hanes has not publicly fired customers, suppliers, or vendors based on political views or religious beliefs.

Charitable giving (including employee matching programs) policies or practices discriminate against charitable organizations based on views or religious beliefs.

**High Risk** 

Hanes HRC CEI rating indicates the company will not donate to non-religious charities unless they embrace controversial sexual identity policies (1)(2).

Employment policies fail to protect against discrimination based on political affiliation/views and/or religion.

High Risk

Hanesbrands does not provide viewpoint protections for its employees (1).

## Corporate Governance and Public Policy



Uses corporate reputation to support ideological causes and/or organizations hostile to freedom Medium Risk of expression.

Hanes CEO Stephen Bratspies is a member of the Business Roundtable and Former CEO Gerald W. Evans signed its 2019 Statement on the Purpose of Corporation, which promotes stakeholder capitalism over traditional obligations to shareholders and customers (1)(2).

Uses corporate funds to advance ideological causes, organizations, or policies hostile to freedom Medium Risk of expression.

Hanes HRC 2023 CEI rating indicates the company covers transgender related costs for its employees and their children, including paid short-term leave, puberty blockers, cross-sex hormones, chest surgeries, genital surgeries, medical visits and lab monitoring, travel and lodging. Additionally, the company has pledged philanthropic support of at least one organization or event that promotes sex and gender ideology ( $\underline{1}$ )( $\underline{2}$ ). By allowing a political stakeholder group to dictate operations, the company increases health care costs and risks dividing employees, alienating customers and harming shareholders ( $\underline{3}$ ).

Uses corporate political contributions for ideological, non-business purposes.
