DESCRIPTION:

Curology does not provide viewpoint protections for its employees. However, Curology has not publicly terminated business relationships due to views or beliefs. It has vocally opposed the overturning of Roe v. Wade and funds groups such as the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), Access Reproductive Justice, and the National Black Women's Reproductive Justice Agenda. The company opposed various state and local legislation intended to protect parental rights, girls' sports, bathroom facilities, and gendered spaces. For these reasons, Curology receives a Medium Risk rating.

Corporate Weaponization

Has denied service to customers, suppliers, or vendors due to their political views or religious Lower Risk beliefs OR corporately boycotts, divests, or sanctions regions, people groups, or industries.

There are no publicly known cases of Curology terminating business relationships due to ideological beliefs.

Charitable giving (including employee matching programs) policies or practices discriminate Lower Risk against charitable organizations based on views or religious beliefs.

Curology does not have a written rule prohibiting donation to religious organizations (1).

Employment policies fail to protect against discrimination based on political affiliation/views High Risk and/or religion.

Curology does not provide viewpoint protections for its employees (1).

Corporate Governance and Public Policy

Uses corporate reputation to support ideological causes and/or organizations hostile to freedom High Risk of expression.

Curology has publicly denounced the Supreme Court decision to overturn Roe v. Wade (<u>1</u>). Curology runs a book club for employees to "unpack, discuss, and process... systemic inequality" (<u>23</u>). Curology opposed the Florida Parental Rights in Education Act, which would prohibit teaching gender identity and sexual orientation to kids in K-3rd grade (<u>4</u>).



Uses corporate funds to advance ideological causes, organizations, or policies hostile to freedom High Risk of expression.

Curology has donated tens of thousands of dollars to the ACLU ($\underline{1}$). After Roe v. Wade was overturned, Curology donated to Access Reproductive Justice and the National Black Women's Reproductive Justice Agenda ($\underline{2}$)($\underline{3}$).

Uses corporate political contributions for ideological, non-business purposes.
